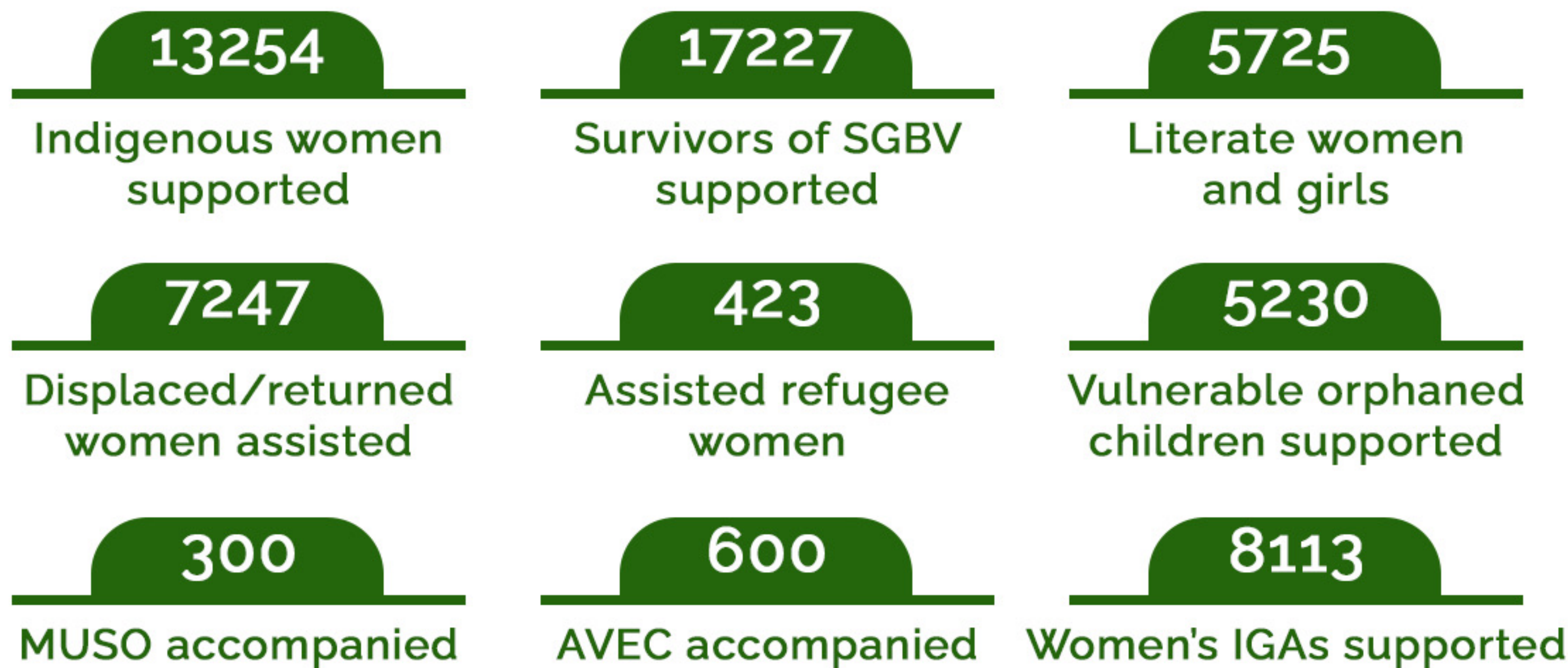


OUR BENEFICIARIALS

- 7** Water, Hygiene and Sanitation (WASH) for women and vulnerable households;
- 8** Emergency Humanitarian Assistance for Displaced, Returned and Refugee Women and Children;
- 9** Advocacy for women's rights, climate and environmental justice.
